St. Johns County 4-H Clover Award Definitions

Achievement – Something accomplished successfully through personal or group effort.

Activity - Non-competitive 4-H sponsored educational experience.

Attend – To be present as a spectator or participant of an activity for the duration of the 4-H event or activity.

Club Level – 4-H event or activity that is coordinated by one or two clubs for their own members.

Community Service – Participate or organize and lead a 4-H community service project and should involve at least 2 hours of time commitment.

Competition - 4-H sponsored events in which awards are granted using standards and rankings.

Contest- Competitive 4-H sponsored educational experience.

County Level – 4-H event or activity that is coordinated or sanctioned through the county 4-H Office or sponsored by a club and open to all 4-H members.

District Level – 4-H event or activity open to all counties within a 4-H District.

4-H Talk to a Community Group – Promotional and informative talk about 4-H and/or your project area to a group of 10 or more people which represent the community as an organized unit. Suggested time is 15 or more minutes including questions and answers.

Participate – Actively engaged in the 4-H contest, event or activity.

Project Plan – Youth will discuss or present in writing their project goals/plans for the year to their adult club leader or 4-H agent.

Record Book – Record of a 4-H member's project experiences for the year. Includes project report, project book, photos with captions and handwritten project story. Other materials are optional.

State Level – 4-H event or activity coordinated or sanctioned through the State 4-H program.

Wildcard – This activity can serve as a substitute for any one clover award requirement other than a project record/book or portfolio.
